Telling Our Past,

Hope of Our Future with Jesus

Being able to say sorry can be tough. If it is a sincere apology, it takes brutal honesty to admit being wrong. In this admission, we open our relationships to better stories than our denials of wrongs could ever have told.

Hebrews 4:13 reads: *“Nothing in all creation is hidden from God’s sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account.”*

God knows everything we are trying to hide, so the broken areas of our stories are already known by Him. The honesty of apologizing and seeking repentance is the beauty of our intellectual honesty crying out with hope and not regret. Our honesty can accept His invitation into better stories rather than obscure our view of the bad stories we try to live without Him.

The difference is between living in story disrupting regret or the integrity of life saving repentance that empowers our stories to be greater than we could even imagine. One destroys our courage while the other takes courage.

After declaring that God knows everything we try to hide, the writer of Hebrews gives us hope that we have a great high priest who intercedes for us and receives our repentance.

In Hebrews 4:14-16, the writer says: *“Since then we have a great high priest... Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with CONFIDENCE draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need!”*

May we have the intellectual honesty to repent and say, “Father, I’m sorry.” Tye
