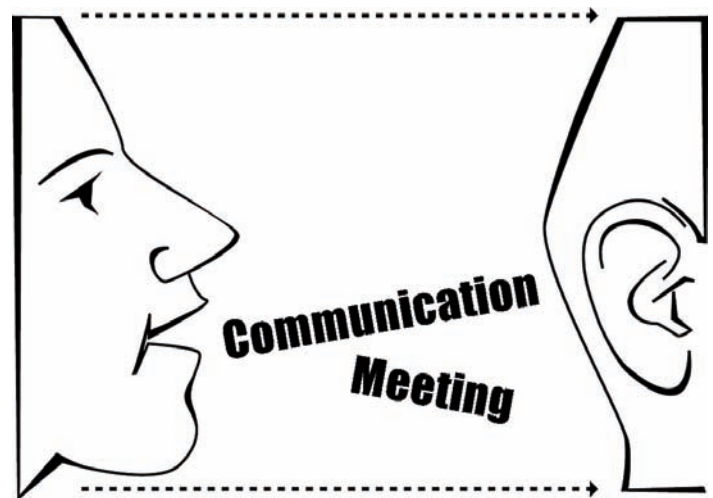

God's Love

We've heard such phrases as "God's love is deeper than the ocean and wider than the sea," but that seems so inadequate. We could compare God's love with the love of a mother for her child, or a policeman risking his life to save someone else's life, but even those analogies fall far short of fully expressing what God's love is like. Without trying to find a comparison, let us merely stand in awe of God's goodness along with David:

"I will extol You, my God, O King; And I will bless Your name forever and ever. Every day I will bless You, and I will praise Your name forever and ever. Great is the LORD, and greatly to be praised; And His greatness is unsearchable. One generation shall praise Your works to another, and shall declare Your mighty acts. I will meditate on the glorious splendor of Your majesty, and on Your wondrous works. Men shall speak of the might of Your awesome acts, and I will declare Your greatness. They shall utter the memory of Your great goodness, and shall sing of Your righteousness.... All Your works shall praise You, O LORD, and Your saints shall bless You." (Psalm 145:1-8,10)

Praise God for his love beyond comparison!

MEETING PLACE OF LOVE

There is a beautiful Hebrew legend of two brothers who lived side by side on adjoining lands. One was the head of a large family, the other lived alone. One night, the wealthy brother lay awake and thought: "My brother lives alone, he has not the companionship of family to cheer his heart as I have. While he sleeps, I will carry some of my wheat sheaves into his field."

At the same hour, the other brother reasoned: "My brother has a large family, and his necessities are greater than mine. As he sleeps, I will put some of my sheaves on his side of the field." Thus the two brothers went out, each laden with sheaves. Each desiring to share his love with his brother.

They met in the middle of the night. They instantaneously realized what each was doing. There they embraced and gloried in the love they had for each other. Hebrew legend says the Jerusalem temple was built on the very spot of their meeting.

Whether or not the legend is true, is it not appropriate? The meeting place of God we share this morning is meant to be a meeting place of love!

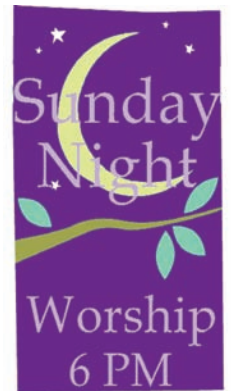
