Hints of a story's purpose and direction are often present at the very beginning. Sometimes we miss the subtle clues, only to remember them later on as the story's themes come out full force.

When Jesus says, "I Am the Light of the World", it is important to remember the central theme of how His story began. Matthew records a star brightly shining in the darkness of the night sky, leading wise men to the place of Jesus' birth. Luke uses light breaking into the darkness in the story of the shepherds keeping watch over their flocks by night while the "glory of the Lord shone around them" as the night sky was filled with the heavenly host singing "Glory to God!" Jesus' birth reveals the truth of who He is!
