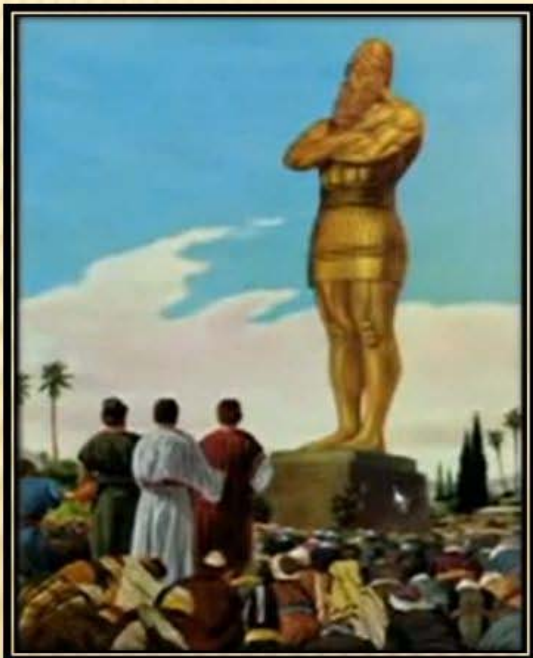

Fishing, boating (kayaks and canoes), bonfire (food included) and devotional.

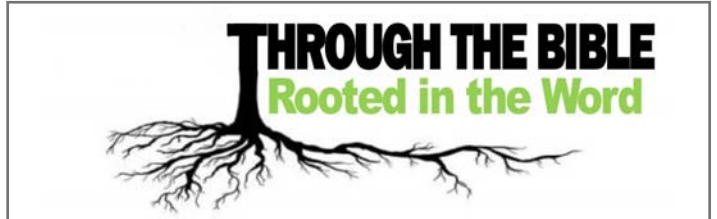

...even if these three men, Noah, Daniel, and Job, were in it (Jerusalem/the land), as I live, declares the Lord God, they would deliver neither son nor daughter. They would deliver but their own lives by their righteousness, declares the Lord God. – Ezekiel 14:14&20

You may wonder why our chronological Bible reading brings us into the story of Job. His story is traditionally understood to take place either before the Exodus or during the same time, making it the oldest book in the Bible. But after reading Ezekiel's words from God, this is an ideal time to read Job. As the people wonder where God is as the people are delivered to exile and live in Babylon, they ask the same questions Job dealt with a long time ago:

“Where is God? Why isn't He doing anything? Why did He cause our struggles? How have we sinned?”

Do these questions sound familiar? God's response to Job is a perfect reminder to the people of God during a time of struggle, “Were you there when I created everything? Don't worry, I understand it all and I take care of it. I am here with you even when it doesn't feel like it. Trust me.”

Being rooted in God's word reveals a story that we can live into with excitement! As we see God continually living into and blessing the lives of His people, our lives are opened to the truth that God is always there, and He understands it all, especially the hard times!!!

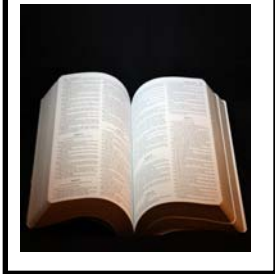
