Encouragement and Counseling Ministry

“What kind of a supervisor are you?!” Is it a question or statement? Perhaps, an individual’s voice tone clarifies the intent connected to this particular comment. If it’s a new employment, they may be seeking information regarding your expectations and style of leadership. If it’s an employee that has been at your particular job site for a year, perhaps it’s a protest.

Our initial experience receiving supervision involves our parents. We are “pretty-much” helpless at the time of our birth and our parents literally have our lives in their hands. If they were conscientious, capable and compassionate then our beginning experiences with supervision probably went well. If they were unable or unwilling to meet our needs then we may have become “very familiar with frustration, anger and protest”.

Generally, our next experience with supervision involves teachers at school. If most of our teachers were thoroughly familiar with what they were teaching, highly motivated and practiced effective classroom management skills then we probably learned to be cooperative, curious and responsive toward their supervision. If some of our teachers were unable to express interest and establish a sense of wellbeing in the classroom then we may have learned reluctance, caution and frustration during those particular classes.

There are other factors involved with “what we take away” from any given set of circumstances. Two people may experience very similar circumstances; one may appear more optimistic, hopeful and competent while the other has a tendency to be more pessimistic and negative. Our perspective and reactions toward supervisory situations are not “all-or-none” and static. As we become aware of our tendencies and reactions, we are able to make adjustments, try new things and experience more successful outcomes. Our spiritual Father and Lord “The Teacher” are very much willing to create inspiration and “Make all things New”. Search and seek for His understanding and will in your supervisory relationships. 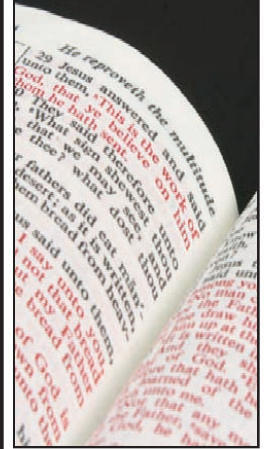
