

Story

Have you ever had one of those moments where you came to your senses and wondered, “what in the world am I doing?” I had one of those recently.

A couple of months ago I was out working on the fence around my goat enclosure. It’s almost an acre in the midst of an area of woods that once had really thick undergrowth. Several trees have died and their fallen remains are everywhere, pushing down smaller trees that now grow in weird “S” shapes to find sunlight once again. As I was trying to reattach an electric fence line that had been knocked down, I noticed a small tree (about 1.5” diameter) that was causing issues with shorting out my fence. I only had a hammer with me at the time, so I decided to use some ingenuity and use my hammer as an axe. I flipped the hammer over to use the sharp edges of the claw, stood over the tree, bent over and started chopping away at the tree about 3 feet from the base of it. After about 6 swings of the hammer, I was half way through the trunk of the tree, thinking to myself how smart this method was and the time that I was saving. On the 7th swing, I saw stars. I thought I had broken my nose as blood was gushing out of it and everything in the middle of my face went numb immediately. What happened was that the tree was still wanting to stand upright and I had released all of the tension (conflict) that had been holding it down. The moment I cut through it, it snapped back up at my face and my nose received the end of it’s force. Lord willing, I have learned and will never do something like that again.

We have these “AHA” moments in our lives where we ask ourselves, “what in the world am I doing?” They are often moments where we realize that spiritually, physically, emotionally, and often relationally our stories are not going in a good direction. We end up in a place where we don’t know where we are, and we need to return to the Father’s house. May these moments open our eyes, our ears, and our hearts to the fact that God is good and He is ready to welcome us home!


